I will state that in the Negroes of this age who have been slaves. there is a degree of disability perhaps greater at the age of 50 and fifty than in the white man. They are generally less well nourished and have gone through hardship which freedom did not amend with new life and vigor. The Claimant is seventy two years old and nine tenths of Negroes at this age are suffering from pains and general debility but do not present pathological evidences of rheumatism or other neurotic diseases.
